

SUBJECT: Selection of two (2) Board Members to serve on the Orange County Board of Education Subcommittee Addressing Public School Facilities

On October 4, 2023, the Orange County Board of Education ("Board"), by unanimous vote, resolved to designate and/or appoint Board subcommittee members to serve on the Board subcommittee to address public school facilities and support a facilities workgroup. This Agenda Item allows the Board to effectuate its resolution to designate and/or appoint subcommittee members.

RECOMMENDATION:

Board action on proposal to designate and/appoint two (2) Board Members to serve on a Board subcommittee to address public school facilities referenced in the October 4, 2023, Resolution Establishing Fair and Equitable Facilities for Public School Students.

<u>Information Item</u>

Under the Education Code, the County Superintendent is the employer for all certificated and classified personnel and; therefore, is responsible for negotiating collective bargaining agreements with labor partners and setting salary for confidential, management, and classified personnel. The State Budget included an 8.22% Cost of Living Adjustment and many of our districts in Orange County are settling for on-going salary increases of 3% to 8%. After completion of the collective bargaining process and ratification by OCSEA and CSEA, the County Superintendent has agreed to the following:

<u>OCSEA</u> – Effective July 1, 2023, for the 2023-24 fiscal year, Orange County School Educators Association receives a 3.25% on-going salary increase and a 2% off-schedule payment. The Department will also pay 50% of the increase in premium costs for health benefits for the 2023-24 plan year. The increased contribution will establish the new permanent maximum on the Department's contribution (the new permanent cap).

<u>CSEA</u> – Effective July 1, 2023, for the 2023-24 fiscal year, California School Employees Association receives a 3% on-going salary increase and a 2% off-schedule payment. The Department will also pay 100% of the increase in premium costs for health benefits for the 2023-24 plan year. The increased contribution will establish the new permanent maximum on the Department's contribution (the new permanent cap).

<u>Confidential, Management and Supervisory</u> will follow the CSEA settlement of a 3% on-going salary increase for 2023-24 and a 2% off-schedule payment, effective July 1, 2023. The Department will also pay 100% of the increase in premium costs for health benefits for the 2023-24 plan year. The increased contribution will establish the new permanent maximum on the Department's contribution (the new permanent cap).

In accordance with Education Code Section 1302 and Board Policy 100-10, below is information for all employees receiving an increase of more than \$10,000 in a 12-month period. The \$10,000 reporting amount was set in statute in 1999, and has not been adjusted since that time. In addition to the employees listed below, we have 11 managers who will receive a salary increase between \$9,000 and \$9,999; 71 teachers, 31 managers and 1 classified member who will receive a salary increase between \$8,000 and \$8,999; and 63 teachers and 44 managers who will receive a salary increase between \$7,000 and \$7,999.
